Events and related activities are well recognised as being central to service delivery. The work has identified useful links across departments, looked to build shared capacity to deliver events, and realise new income generating opportunities in order to improve financial viability and service sustainability. Events provide an excellent vehicle for active engagement of both existing and new target audiences, and are a proactive way to be 'inspiring' and to 'bring alive' museums, heritage, arts and culture – central tenets of the vision and mission of the Monmouthshire Museums Service.
