Ward Matters

I attend most Community Council meetings and continue to liaise and support the various activities in the villages. The amount of work undertaken by volunteers of all ages never ceases to amaze me however, as without them; so many interest groups would not exist. I assist and liaise with the Police, updating on local issues, and involvement with grant applications for local churches, and other Groups. I have dealt with the considerable number of variety of matters brought to the attention of the Community Council. Issues relating to planning, waste disposal and highways are always 'hot topics'.

Council Committees

I sit on the Planning Committee with its wide and interesting responsibilities, visiting application sites and listening to representations at Planning meetings each month.

I am Vice-Chair of the Lower Wye Area Committee; we meet to discuss local issues with the Community. The public are often present, bringing local and important issues to the table.

I am one of the Counties two representatives on the Brecon Beacons National Park Authority. I am involved with the Planning and Rights of Way Committee and Audit and Scrutiny Committee (vice-chair) together with the Standards Committee on this Authority.
