

1. Apologies

Apologies were received from members: Anthea Fairey, Sheila Hampshire, Phil Mundell, Martin Sweeney and Ann Webb. It was also noted that Paul Keeble, MCC Highways and Bob Campbell, NRW have also sent their apologies.

AU welcomed members to the first face to face meeting of the current LAF. The Chair also introduced Maxine Watson-Whittaker who was attending as an observer having been recently appointed by the British Horse Society as an access volunteer in Newport. Members and observers introduced themselves.

2. Declarations of Interest

There were no declarations of interest.

3. To confirm and sign the minutes of the Monmouthshire Local Access Forum meeting of 6 December 2021

The minutes of the meeting of 6 December 2021 were considered and **IB** proposed an amendment in respect of the item 5 so the agreed action read "The LAF supports in principle the proposed approach to develop an inclusive user-strategy for all lower Wye UCRs and linked public rights of way, *subject to receiving further details*". With this amendment the minutes were proposed by **MS**, seconded by **DS** and approved as a correct record. The need for a consequential amendment to the draft annual report was noted.

The Chair agreed to take Agenda Item 6 (Gwent Regional Access Group) first:

4. Gwent Regional Access Group

RG explained the background to the establishment of a Gwent Regional Access Group. The Gwent Green Grid Partnership (GGGP) is a collaborative project funded through Welsh Government's RDP ENRaW programme developing and delivering a common approach to managing green infrastructure, including the countryside access network. The programme strands include preparing a strategic access plan identifying missing links and areas where improvements are needed in the countryside access network, planning, and delivering improvements to support community well-being. To assist this process a Gwent Regional Access Group is being established. Membership will be made up of the local access forums. Each area will be able to put forward 2 to 4 representatives. It is hoped the group will advise on access projects and the strategic access plan and become part of the legacy of the GGGP programme to help coordinate access improvements and support future strategic funding bids. SL asked about the group's practical aims. RG advised it would help advise on practical improvements being funded by the programme, help the creation of strategic plan and help develop a long-term vision for improvements across Gwent. AU noted there was considerable variation in recorded rights of way across local authorities. SF asked if the aim was to encourage more Gwent wide promoted routes. RG & RR indicated that there was an open mind on this, that would depend on how the process developed but certainty could include looking at missing links and possibly re-promoting longer routes such as the Usk Valley Walk.

Agreed The following members volunteered and were nominated to represent the LAF on the regional group: Anne Underwood: Shan Lewis and David Smith

5. Membership Update

The Secretary reported that David Farnsworth had tendered his resignation.

6. Staffing Update and LAF Secretary Role

The Secretary updated members on the creation of a new permanent Community Links Officer post as an addition to the Countryside Access Team. The post will enable and support community involvement. It will lead on working with volunteers, local path care groups, friends groups, Community Councils and others to facilitate volunteer and community input to help resolve outstanding issues, especially those issues that will not otherwise be addressed. The post has now closed and a number

of applications have been received. It was noted that unfortunately the temporary Public Rights of Way Officer post advertised at the same time had attracted no applications and so will now be readvertised. Should that post be filled it is intended it will take over the role of LAF Secretary.

7. Review / discussion on the forum's purpose and future work programme

As this was the first face to face meeting **AU** invited members to reflect on the LAF's role and how it might best plan its future work programme. **SL** supported being more proactive to promote local access in communities, including supporting the role of community councils. **AU** suggested there could be subgroups to look at this, and to encourage greater collaboration in the management of Wentwood.

RR outlined how the former user group had worked and suggested a subgroup to help focus the countryside access team's work with communities and support the new community links post would be helpful. Such a group could asset in targeting grant supported work and also feed into the wider regional discussions. The group could if felt appropriate draw in wider representation. IB supported any approach that would help break the cycle of locally reported issues important to local communities not being dealt with as they were afforded a lower priority rating. The role of volunteers, both organised and unofficial was discussed.

A number of potential work items were identified. Following discussion, the Secretary summarised the resulting future work programme which would be included in Appendix 2 to the annual report:

- b) Subject to consultation with Newport CC and other key partners to seek to establish a Wentwood subgroup to re-establish liaison arrangements in respect of Wentwood Forest.
- c) The draft future work programme, as above, for inclusion in the annual report
- d) NRW will consider the most appropriate mechanism for the forum's engagement in the consultation on Forest Resource Plans

8. Annual report 2020/21

The Secretary presented the draft annual report prepared by the appointing authority to cover the first year of this forum's activity.

Agreed the annual report was approved for publication subject to inclusion of the consequential amendment from the amendment to the last meeting's minutes (as item 3) and inclusion of the forward work programme as agreed under the previous item.

9. Dates and timing of future meetings.

The forum agreed that the Secretary will endeavour to arrange the next meeting in July, followed by meetings in Oct 2022 and Jan 2023.

AU thanked members for their attendance and the meeting closed at 16:10 pm.

UPDATE

MEETING: MONMOUTHSHIRE LOCAL ACCESS FORUM

DATE: 19 JULY 2022

1. PURPOSE:

1.1 To update the Forum on changes to the Countryside Access team and related matters.

1.2 To bring to the attention of the Local Access Forum changes to the Welsh Government's Access Improvement Grant and to advise members on potential projects for 2022 – 25.

2. RECOMMENDATION:

2.1 To approve the Access Improvement Grant projects as proposed

3. BACKGROUND:

- 3.1 Interviews have now taken place and a Community Links Officer has been appointed and is expected to start on 1st August 2022. This is a new, full time post established to enable community volunteering. The post holder will lead on working with volunteers, local path care groups, friends groups, community councils and others to help facilitate volunteer and community input to resolving outstanding issues. The post will support both practical volunteer and community tasks and facilitate groups independent involvement. To support this role a community links project is proposed within the 2022-25 Access Improvement Grant.
- 3.2 The aim of the Welsh Government's Access Improvement Grant (AIG) is to support improving access to/on the Public Rights of Way network, open access land, green and blue space in Wales. It was established in 2020-2021 providing funding to local authorities (and Pembrokeshire and Brecon Beacons National Park Authorities). A further £5.6 million has been allocated in 2022-2025 to enable these improvements to continue.
- 3.3 The budget is allocated to authorities via a formula, based on length of Public Rights of Way, total access land and population. In Monmouthshire this amounts to an allocation of £65,128 in 2022-2023 and £80,775 in the years 2023-2025.

The funding can be used to support projects in the following areas:

PF1 Physical improvements to existing routes (e.g. surface, furniture)

- PF2 Improvements to information and promotion (e.g. signage, way marking, leaflets, panels)
- PF3 Improvements to access/egress points to open access land and green space
- PF4 Improvements to accessing water for water related recreation (e.g. access/egress points, new signage/information, wash down facilities)
- PF5 Increasing under-represented groups' access to the outdoors (e.g. accessibility improvements, information)
- 3.4 Two funding conditions have come into existence from 2023-24:
 - the existence of a fully functioning Local Access Forum
 - authorities must have a Rights of Way Improvement Plan (ROWIP) in place (fully signed off/approved by respective cabinets)
- 3.5 Funding allocations will be reduced by 25% for each element so if an authority is non-compliant on both then their allocation will be reduced by 50%. Any savings will be reallocated to other authorities. Monmouthshire County Council is compliant with both conditions.
- 3.6 The projects that Monmouthshire has currently proposed have been submitted to Welsh Government in draft form. All of the projects relate to Monmouthshire's Well-Being Plan and Monmouthshire's Countryside Access Improvement Plan, as well as other national and local policies and plans.
- 3.7 The projects are as outlined in the table below:-

- 3.8 In addition to AIG the Wye Valley AONB unit can make applications under Welsh Government's Sustainable Landscapes Sustainable Places (SLSP) grant which supports, amongst other themes, sustainable tourism. This can include complementary access improvements where meeting specific needs.
- 3.9 The AONB unit's bid, as with the AIG also over three years, includes Lower Wye Valley Tourism & Access Improvements:

- Wye Valley Walk enhancements at Wyesham & within the Piercefield estate to make the path safer and more convenient for users
- Integrated Access Strategy Support to manage the necessary engagement and consultation, and the preparation of an integrated countryside access strategy in the Monmouthshire part of the Lower Wye Valley as discussed at previous LAF meetings.
- 3.10 The proposed projects are under discussion with Welsh Government and if approved will be the subject of further reports to the forum.
