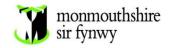

In preparation for the next meeting and the new academic year, reference was made to providing a crib sheet which would indicate to students what items were available and how much they can apply for. Although there was potential for this to be seen more as a 'wish list', it was noted that the issue is being discussed with Coleg Gwent as something that could be used to raise awareness at the Registration stage.
