#### 1. PURPOSE:

Under section 7 of the Local Government (Wales) Measure 2011, a local authority must secure the provision of reasonable training and development opportunities for its members. The Welsh Government has produced statutory guidance under the 2011 Measure and recommends that local authorities provide opportunities for what is essential for a local authority member to perform their role effectively. The guidance goes onto suggest a non-exhaustive list of some of the areas in which local authorities may wish to consider providing training for their members which includes:-

- Induction.
- Role and functions of the executive, the council and its officers.
- Overview and scrutiny.
- Information technology.
- Code of conduct.
- The role of a councillor as a local member.
- Public engagement.
- · Equality and diversity training.

The guidance recommends that the Democratic Services Committee has overall responsibility for deciding what should be regarded as reasonable training and development opportunities as part of its function of providing support to members to carry out their functions.

Specialist training for members of the planning, licensing and audit committees is provided by the council.
