Age	The Allocations Policy strives to provide a fair process in accessing social accommodation. There are instances where a household may be more vulnerable due to, in whole or in part, age, and to mitigate this additional preference may be awarded. Examples of this are care leavers under the age of 21 or under or households with dependent children under the age of 5 in a flat. Some of the social accommodation stock is age restricted and can only be accessed by households over the age of 55 or 60 which reduces the general wait times for those of an advanced age to access social housing.	Age restricted accommodation does exclude those who do not meet the age criteria, and therefore there is often a difference in the wait time between age restricted and general needs accommodation. Whilst this does have negative impacts, it is felt this is necessary to provide an appropriate service for older residents.	Older persons' accommodation can and will be offered to younger applicants where there is insufficient demand.

Disability	Applicants with a disability will not be disadvantaged when applying for social housing. Depending on circumstance there are provisions to award additional preference to disabled applicants where it can be demonstrated that their disability has a detrimental impact on their ability to live independently. Where a household with a disability is found to need adaptations as confirmed by an Occupational Therapist the household will be allocated a suitable property. In some extreme but rare cases a property may be purpose built to meet the needs of a disabled applicant (or member of their household).	Due to the limited availability of adapted accommodation stock households where a disability is present may face longer waiting periods for a social property.	The Homesearch Partnership raise any concerns regarding households where there is a significant disability. Funding streams are utilised where possible to meet the needs of these households.
Gender reassignment	The Allocations Policy strives to provide a fair process in accessing social accommodation. Gender, or gender reassignment, is not considered during the allocation process.	There are no negative impacts associated with this characteristic.

The purpose of the Allocations Policy is to provide fair and consistent access to affordable housing in Monmouthshire.

Due to the limited availability of social housing stock it is necessary to implement a banding system to ensure that those who are most vulnerable are prioritised.

The income of a household is considered for general needs affordable accommodation. Where a household either owns a property, or their income exceeds the threshold in the policy they will be deemed to have sufficient financial resources to secure alternative settled accommodation and therefore not have a housing need. This affords greater opportunity for households whose economic disadvantage restricts settled accommodation options to access affordable housing.

An additional criteria has been included in the Policy to allow flexibility with regards to demotion and suspension where arrears have been incurred in private rented housing in order take into account the higher cost of renting privately.

There are no negative impacts of the proposal on people suffering socioeconomic disadvantage.

Negative: No negative impacts identified by the proposed changes.	 The Allocations Policy tries to maximise the efficiency of affordable housing stock through a number of ways. Some of these include: Implementing a banding system to identify those most vulnerable in housing need; Criteria around maximising occupancy; Allowing single/ couple households with overnight child access arrangements to have equal priority for an above ground floor flat 2-bedroom flat (subject to affordability assessment). This serves both to support the allocation of one-bedroom ground floor units to those with mobility issues, and also to utilise some of the lesser desired units more effectively; Allocating adapted properties to applicants/households where a matching disability is present.

Prevention Worse	Putting resources into preventing problems occurring or getting	There is a significant shortage of affordable, settled accommodation in Monmouthshire. The Allocations Policy seeks to distribute affordable housing stock fairly to those on the housing register. To maximise the efficiency of allocations there have been amendments to allow for the flexibility in allocating accommodation. This is to maximise the utilisation across all stock, including unit types that can be harder to let, whilst freeing up units that are high in demand.		
Integration other bodies	Considering impact on all wellbeing goals together and on	The effects of inappropriate housing and homelessness on the wellbeing of people is well founded. These effects also impact on other services and agencies such as health, justice and social care. The Allocation Policy and its proposed amendments seek to utilise affordable housing stock in the county in a fair and transparent way to alleviate these wide-reaching negative impacts.

Positive: The proposed changes from the Review of the Allocations Policy will help to make the document more accessible through streamlining and simplifying content where possible. Changes to policy have been made with regards to the current and ongoing socioeconomic environment and housing demand trends. The policy aims to balance the efficiency of social housing stock in Monmouthshire with the need for affordable accommodation of all types.

Negative: There will be a minor impact on those who have come through the Homeless route and are found to have sufficient financial resources. However, these thresholds have been increased in line with the rising cost of living and so the impact on applicants on the housing register will be minimal.
